Showjumping running under BRC option 3, full details/rules highlighted below

RING ONE

FIRST ROUNDS IN RING TWO, SECOND ROUNDS IN RING ONE

Class 1 - Junior 70cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals)

Teams of four riders or individuals jumping 70cm (first round)

Class 2 - Senior 70cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals)

Teams of four riders or individuals jumping 70cm (first round)

Class 3 - Junior 80cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals) inc. SWWRC qualifier (Teams Only) Teams of four riders or individuals jumping 80cm (first round)

Class 4 - Senior 80cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals) inc. SWWRC qualifier (Teams Only) Teams of four riders or individuals jumping 80cm (first round)

Class 5 - Junior 90cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals) inc. SWWRC qualifier (Teams Only) Teams of four riders or individuals jumping 90cm (first round)

Class 6 - Senior 90cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals) inc. SWWRC qualifier (Teams Only) Teams of four riders or individuals jumping 90cm (first round)

SWWRC qualifiers will run alongside BRC qualifiers with SWWRC placings combining all classes (3, 4, 5, 6) and teams eligible.

Class 7—100cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals)

Mixed class open to senior and junior teams and individuals, teams may be any combination of senior and/or junior jumping 100cm (first round).

Class 8 —105cm Show Jumping (teams and individuals)

Mixed class open to senior and junior teams and individuals, teams may be any combination of senior and/or junior jumping 105cm (first round).

RING TWO

Class 9 - Junior Style Jumping (teams and individuals)

Teams consist of two riders jumping 75cm and two riders jumping 85cm

Individuals choose either to jump 75cm or 85cm

Class 10 - Senior Style Jumping (teams and individuals)

Teams consist of two riders jumping 75cm and two riders jumping 85cm

Individuals choose either to jump 75cm or 85cm

DEPENDING ON ENTRIES, CLASSES MAY NOT RUN IN THE ABOVE ORDER OR RINGS

WE ARE HOPING TO START THE RINGS at 9.00am. No one to be riding 30 minutes before the first time published.

PAPER DECLARATIONS MUST BE MADE ON DAY AT LEAST 30 MINUTES PRIOR TO THE START OF THE COMPETITION

All riders should present to the steward a minimum of 20 minutes before their time.

NOTES FOR REGIONAL QUALIFIER ENTRIES

80cm & 90cm show jumping classes are eligible for the Regional Championships

These classes are for teams only, not for individuals.

If you ONLY wish to enter for the Regional Championships, you need not pay the prelim entry to BRC Office.

You may not change your mind and enter the national qualifier after the close of prelim entry.

All national entries who do not qualify will also be included in selection for the Regional Championships.

STYLE JUMPING

It is open to teams of four riders and to individuals. Each team consists of two riders jumping a 75cm course and two riders jumping an 85cm course. Individuals may choose the height at which they jump. Riders jump one round and are judged on the style of their riding. When jumping, the rider is judged on how they ride the whole course, particular attention being given to how they ride the turns and present the horse at a fence. The rider needs to show balanced approaches to the fences and be able to maintain a good forward canter in a rhythm. The position of the rider at take-off, in the air, on landing and in the following strides is assessed along with the correct judgement of pace. It is assumed that the rider is aware of the correct leading leg and is able to change it if needed (a flying change correctly and quietly done is acceptable as is a simple change through trot). Style Jumping will be run under the Show Jumping rules set out in section SJ1 unless superseded in this section Please refer to BRC rulebook p.65-6

Entry Fees and Details

INDIVIDUAL STYLE ENTRIES - £15

TEAM STYLE ENTRIES - £60

INDIVIDUAL SHOWJUMPING ENTRIES - £19

Medical cover included

Late prelim entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with a late surcharge of £20 per team and £10 per individual (payable to BRC HQ), if there are sufficient spaces. Late entries cannot be guaranteed therefore must not be paid for until approval from the organiser has been sought. If the date of the qualifier is cancelled for any reason, the close of prelim entry will remain.

However, if the qualifier is moved more than 21 days later, entries will be re-opened but late entry fees cannot be refunded. Eligibility will be approved at the original close of prelim entry. Refunds will only be made if a vet or doctors certificate is provided.

Substitutions - Late simple substitutions may be made at the time teams are declared.

Complex substitutions must be made by 6pm Monday 20th May 2024, before times are published. A complex substitution is one where teams are rearranged or horse and rider combinations are moved from one team to another. Simple substitutions are ones where a

horse and/or rider replaces the withdrawn one in the same team and position. For complex substitutions email kellyj1479@gmail.com

Showjumping classes will run under option 3

Rule book: SJ1 8.1 – 8.3 (pages 51-53) for full details

Option 3 Each team will jump two rounds (with the second round being split into two parts – part one being the second round and part two will be the individual jump-off). Each team member will jump both rounds with the best three scores to count in each round for the team total. If a team member is eliminated or gains in excess of 24 jumping penalties in the first round, they are not permitted to compete in the second round.

Option 3 The score of both rounds will be added together, with the lowest number of penalties determining the placings.

BRC RULES: It is important that all competitors are aware of the rules relating to this competition. It will run under British Riding Club Rules as in the BRC Handbook 2024 and its subsequent amendments. This can be found at:

Eligibility It is the Team Managers' and competitors' responsibility to ensure they and their horses are eligible for these classes.

Parental Consent It is the Team Manager's responsibility to gain parental consent for juniors to enter this event It is the team managers' and competitors' responsibility to ensure they are aware of all relevant rules regarding the competition, tack, whips and turnout etc.

Hats: All hats must meet the BRC current standard (Jan 24) and have a visible pink hat tag in place before they are worn on the showground. There will be a trained official available on the day to do this for you if your hat does not currently have one.

Body protectors: A body protector is strongly recommended in show jumping competitions. From 1 Jan 2024, the BRC standard is the Blue 2018 Label.

Flu Vaccinations: Your horse's influenza vaccination record must be up to date in line with rule G7 in the current BRC Handbook. This record must be checked for all the qualifier classes prior to competing.

Numbers: Number Bibs to be worn and competitors to bring their own numbers. Numbers can be printed out from Riding Club Results.

Lorry & vehicle parking: All drivers must adhere to instructions from the Parking Stewards when given.

Lorries and Trailers must park with consideration for others and should be at least 3m apart. Horses or ponies tied to a vehicle/trailer must not be left unattended or left in trailers that have been detached from towing vehicle.

Competitors MUST NOT muck out vehicles on showground.

Riders and spectators at all events should always behave appropriately. No riders or spectators shall behave in an offensive, abusive or unpleasant manner to any person.

Children under 16 must be under adult supervision at all times.

Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and dog muck must be picked up.

All attending must have regard and consideration for other property and ensure that all rubbish is deposited in bins provided or removed from the area to a suitable place or taken back home for disposal.

Late pre-entries: Late pre-entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with a late surcharge of £10 per individual and £20 per team (payable to BRC HQ) if space permits. Late entries cannot be guaranteed and approval from the organiser is required.

Event abandonment: Should the event be abandoned due to weather or any other circumstances, VOURC reserve the right to retain 25% of entry fees to cover non-refundable costs.

The Organisers reserve the right to cancel, or add sections to, classes or alter the running order depending on entries.

They cannot be held responsible for any errors or inaccuracies in the schedule. The Judge's decision is final. Any complaint must be made to the organiser or official steward within 30 mins of the incident, or the result being published online. They will be handled as in the BRC Handbook, G14.

The Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to any class

The Organisers reserve the right to ask anybody to leave the show ground.

Health, Safety & Welfare

The organisers of this event have taken every reasonable precaution to ensure the Health & Safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organiser and all official stewards.

If attending the Show on your own, you MUST ensure that your Team Manager or another team member has your emergency contact name and telephone number.

Any competitor who has had a fall in a warm-up area, competition arena or anywhere on site must see the paramedic before remounting to start the competition/phase and must follow their instructions.

Neither VOURC, BRC Area 15, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landowner or his/her tenant, will hold themselves responsible for any accident to persons, property and/or horses. By entering this competition, competitors accept the risks involved in horse riding and competing.
